Onc (1) of the CO's extended the contract time period for a total of forty-nine (49) calendar days because of inclement weather and installation coordination with Centre activities. The other CO's were associated with minor revisions due to unforeseen conditions during construction.

The contract was substantially completed on April 29, 2016 in accordance to the contract ending date. Since that time Manley's staff and sub-contractors have pursued a limited punch list, in addition to close-out documents consisting of the warranties and service manuals.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

On December 17, 2015, the Council awarded Public Works Contract 2015-06 to Micon Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$580,946 for site preparation for the new playgrounds at Rynerson and Del Valle Parks.

In awarding the contract, Council authorized staff to approve a cumulative total of change orders as necessary not to exceed \$58,000. Seven (7) change orders (COs) were negotiated throughout the construction period resulting in a final contract amount of \$610,579.56. The net additional amount to the contract was \$29,633.56 – about 5% of the overall contract amount, and under the amount authorized by Council. Two (2) of the CO's extended the contract time period for a total of forty-three (43) calendar days because of inclement weather and project schedule coordination for play equipment installation at Del Valle Park. The other CO's were associated with minor revisions due to unforeseen conditions during construction.

The contract was substantially completed on May 20, 2016 in accordance to the contract ending date. Since that time Micon's staff and sub-contractors have pursued a limited punch list, in addition to close-out documents consisting of the workmanship warranty and as-built drawings.

SECTION 2. The fees or charges for bin and special service set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto, have been adjusted by the Director of Administrative Services based on the escalation rate. Said adjusted fees or charges shall be effective on July 1, 2016, and shall be the maximum fees or charges collected by the Contractor for special bin service.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution, and the same shall be effective as of the 1st day of July, 2016.

### SUBJECT: Exclusive Sales Agreement for Two Sky Knight Helicopters

### INTRODUCTION

The City owns two Schweizer helicopters, which will soon be retired from the Sky Knight program as surplus property and be sold. Due to the required paperwork, regulations, contacts and value it is recommended that the City utilize the services of a broker for the sale of the helicopters.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

HeliSafe, LLC of Long Beach, California is an aviation consulting company specializing in aviation asset management, operations and training, and other special services including aircraft brokerage. With over thirty years of experience in the industry, Helisafe has provided a wide range of these services to the private sector, law enforcement and military.

HeliSafe has submitted an Aircraft Exclusive Sales Agreement for the two helicopters. HeliSafe will be granted exclusive rights to sell the Schweizer helicopters for a period of six months, subject to extension by mutual agreement. The broker will charge a flat rate of 5 percent commission on the final aircraft sales price. The City Attorney has reviewed and approved the agreement.

The proposed sales agreement is in lieu of the provision in the Purchasing Policy, that states surplus supplies and equipment with value equal to or greater than \$5,000 shall be sold only by sealed bid and such sales shall be awarded by the City Council to the highest bidder.

The Public Safety Committee reviewed the reasons for utilizing the services of a broker and recommend using the broker at HeliSafe, LLC to sell the helicopters.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the Exclusive Sales Agreement with HeliSafe, LLC and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement on behalf of the City.

At that time, residential alleys were required by the General Plan to be 30 feet wide, therefore whenever certain improvement thresholds were met, a dedication was required. Residential alleys are now required to be only 25 feet; therefore, only 2 and a half feet of additional Right-of-Way is needed from a property. As some properties have never dedicated any portion for the alley, the alley is essentially 20 feet wide. Vacating the 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  feet does not reduce the usable width.

Pursuant to the Public Streets, Highways, and Service Easements Vacation Law of the Streets and Highway Code, the City Council may vacate a public street by adopting a resolution ordering the vacation. The City may vacate a street or an alley if the City determines the need for the general public to travel upon it, or the City to operate and maintain it, or utilities to place their facilities within it, no longer exists. The portion of the street or alley vacated would then become private. The Code allows the City to summarily vacate a street or alley if it has not been used for vehicle travel for 5 years and no public money was expended for maintenance. These conditions are met for the 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  foot portion under consideration for vacation.

Staff has reviewed the request and recommends that it would be beneficial to vacate the subject alley. Upon reviewing the site, it has been deemed that it is no longer necessary for the City to retain alley rights-of-way for this portion of the alley. The Circulation Element of the City's General Plan does not show the alley as an essential roadway for circulation purposes, nor does it appear that the proposed vacation will result in a diversion or modification of existing traffic patterns.

On May 5, 2016, the Lakewood Planning and Environment Commission made the finding that the proposed vacation was consistent with the Circulation Element of the City of Lakewood's General Plan per Government Code Section 65402.

### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Conduct a public hearing for the proposed vacation of the subject alley.
- 2. Adopt the attached Resolution ordering the vacation of the portion of the alley, as described in the Resolution, east of Seine Avenue, between 207<sup>th</sup> and 209<sup>th</sup> Streets.
- 3. Direct the City Clerk to send a certified copy of the Resolution to the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder for recordation and a copy of the Resolution to the Los Angeles County Assessor.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2016-23

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD VACATING A 2 ½ FOOT BY 50 FOOT SECTION OF THE PUBLIC ALLEY EAST OF SEINE AVENUE BETWEEN 207TH AND 209TH STREETS AND WITHIN THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, AND AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED IN SAID RESOLUTION, AND SHOWN ON MAP ATTACHED HERETO.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. These proceedings are pursuant to the Public Streets, Highways and Service Easement Vacation Law, commencing with <u>Section 8300 of the Streets & Highways Code of the</u> <u>State of California</u>. The City Council hereby finds and determines that the following described easement for street or highway purposes consisting of a portion of an alley should be vacated pursuant to Chapter 2 of said law for the reason that, subject to the conditions herein imposed, said portion of alley is unnecessary for present or prospective public use.

SECTION 2. The City Council finds that the proposed vacation is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act inasmuch as it is a minor alteration of streets and similar facilities and will not involve the removal of scenic resources, including a stand of trees, rock outcroppings or a historic building.

SECTION 3. The City Council has previously adopted a General Plan including a Circulation Element. As required by <u>Section 65402 of the Government Code of the State of</u> <u>California</u>, the City Council confirms the finding of the Planning & Environment Commission that the proposed vacation of a portion of the alley is in conformity with the Circulation Element of the adopted General Plan of the City of Lakewood.

SECTION 4. The City Council further finds as follows:

- A. The portion of the alley to be vacated is not useful as a non-motorized transportation facility and, pursuant to <u>Streets & Highways Code 892</u>, may be abandoned.
- B. Said portion of alley subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth is unnecessary for present or prospective public use.

SECTION 5. Said portion of Alley as described in Exhibit "A" and as shown on the Map (Exhibit "B") attached hereto is vacated.





**SUBJECT:** Permit Applications for Sale of Fireworks

### INTRODUCTION

Sections 3105 through 3106 of the Lakewood Municipal Code identify the requirements to be met and the procedures to be followed by applicants for a permit to sell fireworks. Since the Fire Prevention Ordinance was amended in 2002, the number of firework stand permits has declined from 36 in 2001 to 26 in 2016.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

Twenty-six (26) organizations have applied for firework stand permits for the 2016 4<sup>th</sup> of July season. These applicants are the same groups that the Lakewood City Council approved in 2015. All stands remained in the same location as last year except for Lakewood High School Grad Nite Boosters, which is now located at the Candlewood Street side of 500 Lakewood Center Mall. All organizations have submitted the proper documentation as required by the Fire Prevention Code.

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### RESOLUTION NO. 2016-24

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD MODIFYING WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES BY REASON OF REGULATIONS IMPOSED BY THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2015, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted an Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation, which mandated that the City of Lakewood's Water Enterprise cut its use of water by 20%; and

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2015, the City Council adopted Urgency Ordinance No. 2015-6, in response to the State Board's Emergency Regulation, which Ordinance implemented "Phase III" of the City's Water Conservation Plan; and

WHEREAS, since the implementation of Phase III, the Water Enterprise and its customers have exceeded the 20% conservation mandate by a substantial margin; and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2016, the State Board adopted its Resolution No. 2016-0029, based on an Executive Order issued by the Governor on May 9, 2016; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution No. 2016-0029 allows a water supplier to self-certify that the supplier's water supply will exceed projected water demand, based on a specific set of criteria; and

WHEREAS, applying such criteria yields a "0%" conservation rate for Lakewood's Water Enterprise; and

WHEREAS, Section 7514 of the Lakewood Municipal Code, created by the adoption of Ordinance No. 2015-6, states that the regulations contained therein shall remain in force and effect until the City Council adopts a Resolution pursuant to Section 7511.1, modifying the implementation of water conservation regulations,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Effective on June 1, 2016, and continuing until modified by City Council Resolution, the watering restrictions set forth in Section 7514(C) shall no longer be in effect. All of the other provisions set forth in Section 7514 shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 2. All responsible City staff members are hereby authorized and directed to comply with all of the requirements of State Board Resolution No. 2016-0029.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Resolution, or any part hereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or portions of this Resolution. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Resolution irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution.

**SUBJECT:** Proposed Ordinance to update and clarify the operating procedures of the Development Review Board.

### INTRODUCTION

Some of the current Development Review Board provisions in the Lakewood Municipal Code are no longer applicable and need to be removed, updated and/or clarified to reflect current operating procedures and practices. Among the items requiring modification are references to the now disestablished Lakewood Redevelopment Agency, application submittal requirements, notification requirements, quorum requirements, review and referral procedures, appeal procedures, and authority for interim appointments to fill temporary vacancies.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The current operating procedures for the Development Review Board ("Board") were established 44 years ago by Ordinance 72-20 and were subsequently amended in 1974 by Ordinance 74-7 regarding provisions referencing the Lakewood Redevelopment Agency and in 1981 by Ordinance 81-6 pertaining to clarifying the purpose of the Board and expanding the authority of the Board to review single-family dwelling projects. The Board procedures require modifications to update and clarify these provisions to reduce the ability of legal challenge to the City by outside counsel.

### SUMMARY

The proposed ordinance will:

- Repeal all references to the disestablished Lakewood Redevelopment Agency.
- Establish the Board quorum requirement to be two of three Board members.
- Define that the Board's actions on projects requiring a subsequent discretionary action by either the Lakewood Planning and Environment Commission or City Council, to be only an advisory recommendation by the Board and not subject to appeal. These projects are all required to have a subsequent public hearing.
- Remove application submittal requirements from the Code, as these are more appropriately implemented as administrative guidelines and public information handouts.
- Clarify the effective date of a Board decision to be five (5) City Business Days after the notice of the decision is posted in the U.S. Mail or by other means acceptable to the applicant, the property owner and any other person requesting notice, unless a written appeal is properly filed within those same five (5) business days. All properly filed appeals shall be scheduled for a future hearing date before the Planning and Environment Commission within thirty (30) City business days following receipt of the properly filed appeal with appropriate fees.

- Acknowledge the Community Development Department Director's ability to determine that certain minor development projects that have no impacts to surrounding properties and/or street views can submit plans and obtain permits without prior Board review.
- Authorizes the Community Development Department Director to replace on a temporary basis a Board member who cannot attend one or more hearings.

### CEQA

The proposed ordinance is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b) (3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. This ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will only modify administrative procedures and not result in any changes to the physical environment.

### **PUBLIC NOTICE**

Pursuant to Section 9422 of the Lakewood Municipal Code and State Law, notice of the public hearing for this amendment was posted on the City's website on May 13, 2016, published in the Press Telegram on May 13, 2016, and posted in three places within the City on May 13, 2016.

### RECOMMENDATION

On May 5, 2016, the Planning and Environment Commission adopted Resolution 8-2016 recommending that the City Council adopt the proposed ordinance. Staff recommends that the City Council introduce the proposed ordinance amending the Lakewood Municipal Code, pertaining to modifications of the Development Review Board procedures, along with the related Categorical Exemption.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2016-2

### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD AMENDING PART 18 OF CHAPTER 3 OF ARTICLE IX OF THE LAKEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD PROCEDURES

# THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** The purpose of this ordinance is to update and clarify the operating procedures of the Development Review Board. This ordinance removes outdated references to the Lakewood Redevelopment Agency, specifies quorum and interim appointment procedures and clarifies appeal procedures.

**SECTION 2**. Part 18 of Chapter 3 of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code pertaining to the Development Review Board, commencing with Section 9480 is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety to read as follows:

### PART 18 DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD

<u>9480. PURPOSES</u>. It is the purpose of this Part to promote the orderly and economic development of the City in accordance with the mandates of the Lakewood General Plan, the Lakewood Municipal Code, including zoning and building regulations and other applicable City regulations, State laws, Federal laws, including any Lakewood adopted Precise or Specific Plans and any amendments thereof.

The City Council finds that the provision of architectural, landscaping and planning advice will assist citizens in the alteration and remodeling with modernization and beautification of their homes. This service will help create a better sense of community identity, encourage pride in beautifying Lakewood and assist in creating a better more harmonious place in which to live. Further the City Council finds that the erection, construction, alteration, expansion or relocation of buildings, structures and appurtenances without the benefit of development review control can adversely affect the development, use, occupancy, health, safety and welfare of surrounding areas for residential, commercial or industrial uses or purposes and affect the health, safety, comfort and general welfare of the inhabitants of Lakewood.

It is the purpose of this Part to maintain and enhance a pleasing urban environment with residential, commercial and industrial properties; promote public convenience and prosperity; conserve the value of land and buildings, maintain and enhance the commercial tax base of the City and encourage the most appropriate use of land within the City.

The Development Review Board shall review proposed developments to assure compliance with the General Plan, the zoning code, the building codes, and other applicable regulations of the City and State. This includes those regulations pertaining to location, building Ordinance No. 2016-2 Page 2

setback lines, lot coverage, maximum height, bulk, number of stories, size and use of lots, yards, courts, open space, storm water storage, intensity and density of land uses, signs, billboards, illumination, accessibility and off-street parking. This also includes regulations pertaining to the use of buildings and structures.

The Board's action on projects requiring a discretionary decision by either the Lakewood City Council or the Lakewood Planning and Environment Commission shall be advisory only and not be subject to appeal.

**<u>9481. DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD</u>**. There is hereby created a Development Review Board ("Board") which shall consist of the Director of Community Development or her/his designee, a licensed architect or equivalent, and a qualified landscape architect or equivalent. The Board members shall serve at the will of the City Council.

The Board shall have the power to adopt its own rules of procedure, with the following limitations:

**A.** A quorum shall consist of two (2) members and a majority vote of any quorum shall govern, which is a minimum of two (2) members. In order to assure that a quorum is available, during times when an appointed member is not available, the Community Development Director shall have the authority to appoint on an interim basis, not to exceed ninety (90) days, a temporary replacement with equivalent training and skills of any appointed member of the Board.

**B.** All meetings shall be held in the Lakewood City Hall, but any meeting may be adjourned to any development site for further discussion and action.

**C.** The Board shall not be required to hold noticed public hearings, but any interested persons shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to be heard by the Board, and the meetings of the Board shall be open to the public.

**D.** Any applicant for development, property owner or her/his designated representative shall be entitled to attend any meeting of the Board and to testify or present evidence on her/his behalf.

**E.** The Board shall cause to be kept and maintained a record of all meetings.

**F.** The Board shall receive, promptly review, pass upon all development plans and promptly report in writing its decision to the applicant, the property owner and the Director of Community Development.

**<u>9482. BUILDING PERMITS</u>**. No person shall construct any building nor shall any building or other permit be issued for any building or structure or alteration or expansion or relocation of any building or structure until the same has been approved by the Board or as determined by the Director of Community Development. Upon approval of such a development plan, the property shall be developed and maintained in accordance with the conditions of approval of the plan and none other.

<u>9483. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS</u>. An application for Board approval shall be filed with the Director of Community Development with or prior to each application for a building permit and shall thereafter be referred to the Board for review. The Director of Community Development or her/his designee may determine that such review is not necessary in those

instances where the proposed building project is only a minor modification or addition that is compatible with the existing building character, complies with the Lakewood Municipal Code and does not substantially modify architectural elements viewable from the street.

The required application materials, plans and site pictures shall be submitted in conformance with the standards that are on file in the office of the Director of Community Development. This includes, where applicable, a site plan, a floor plan, a roof plan, four-sided elevations and landscaping and irrigation plans. The submitted plans shall be fully dimensioned with orientation, showing all proposed and existing structures on the entire parcel.

**<u>9483.1. FEE.</u>** The Development Review fee shall be as established by City Council Resolution and added to each building permit fee as required by Article VIII of the Lakewood Municipal Code. The purpose of the fee shall be to reimburse the City for its estimated cost in reviewing the plans.

<u>9484. POWERS AND DUTIES OF DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD</u>. The Board shall determine whether the proposed development is in compliance with this Chapter, other provisions of this Code and other applicable laws. In addition, the Board shall determine whether or not the purposes and objectives of this Part has been met, and in that regard conditions may be imposed to assure that the purposes and objectives of this Part will be realized.

Consideration shall be given to site plans, landscaping, general design and development, setbacks, heights, vehicular and pedestrian ingress and egress, and relationship of such factors to existing development in the immediate or surrounding areas, as well as proposed future development in the surrounding or immediate areas as indicated on any General or Specific Plan of the City.

<u>9484.1. FINDINGS</u>. The Board, in compliance with the foregoing, may approve, conditionally approve subject to modifications, or disapprove any application for a building permit to relocate, construct, alter, expand or demolish such a building or structure provided all of the following findings are made:

**A.** The proposed use and development project are consistent with the Lakewood General Plan and any applicable Specific Plan.

**B.** The proposed use and development project are consistent with the Lakewood Municipal Code including zoning regulations, development standards and building codes.

**C.** The site of the proposed use and development project is adequate in size and shape to accommodate the proposed yards, walls, fences, buildings, parking and loading facilities, landscaping, and other development features as required by the Lakewood Municipal Code.

**D.** The site for the proposed use and development project is served by highways or streets adequate in width and which are improved as necessary to carry the kind and quantity of traffic generated by both the proposed use and surrounding existing uses.

**E.** Granting the proposed use and development project does not constitute a special privilege that is not available to others within the same zone.

**F.** The proposed use and development project will not adversely affect or be materially detrimental to adjacent uses, buildings or structures, environmental considerations or otherwise endanger the general public health, safety or welfare, including but not limited to unreasonable levels of noise, obnoxious odors, vibration, glare, and visual obstructions. All conditions required further a compelling government interest.

**<u>9484.2. SITE PLAN APPROVAL.</u>** In approving the development plan, the Board shall approve the site plan showing thereon the location of all buildings, structures, freestanding signs, off-street parking facilities, outdoor seating areas, trash enclosures, improvements, facilities, utilities, landscaping, storm water detention/retention, accessible paths-of-travel, storage areas and exterior elevation plans.

**9485. BOARD DECISION.** If the applicant or other project representative does not attend the Board meeting and the decision of the Board is to approve the development plan as submitted with only insignificant or minor changes, approval may be granted at that time. Otherwise, the Board may continue consideration of the proposed development to a future meeting of the Board. The applicant shall be given reasonable time to appear and present evidence on her/his behalf. The Board may withdraw the project from further consideration, if the applicant fails to attend a second or more scheduled hearings.

In the instance where the proposed development project requires a Conditional Use Permit or other discretionary action by the Planning and Environment Commission and/or the City Council, then the action of the Board shall be an advisory recommendation to the Planning and Environment Commission and shall not be considered a final action or be subject to appeal.

Otherwise, the decision of the Board shall be final and conclusive, and effective five (5) City business days after giving of notice thereof via the United States Postal Service to the applicant, the property owner and any other person requesting notice, unless within that five (5) City business days an appeal in writing is properly filed with the Secretary of the Planning and Environment Commission by the applicant, property owner, any protestant, or any member of the City Council. Any person entitled to or requesting notice of the Board decision may waive his or her notification and/or request notification by another means (e.g. e-mail).

### 9486. APPEAL BEFORE THE PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION. All

properly filed appeals shall, within thirty (30) days following receipt of the appeal and required fees, be scheduled for a future hearing date before the Planning and Environment Commission. A written Notice of Hearing shall be delivered and sent via the United States Postal Service at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing. The notice shall be sent to the appellant, the applicant, the property owner and any other person requesting notice of the time and place of the hearing. No other notice of the hearing is required. The Notice of Hearing may be waived and/or delivery method substituted by another means of notification by any person entitled thereto.

The Planning and Environment Commission in making its determination shall consider the record before the Board and such additional evidence deemed relevant and received by it at the hearing. The Planning and Environment Commission in making the determination shall be governed by the terms and provisions of this Part, and its decision shall be final, conclusive and Ordinance No. 2016-2 Page 5

effective five (5) City business days after the giving of notice thereof unless within that time period an appellant files a written appeal of the decision to the City Council with the City Clerk.

**<u>9486.1. APPEAL BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL</u>**. The appeal hearing before the City Council in the event of such a properly filed appeal shall be noticed, held and determined within the same time and manner specified herein for appeals to the Planning and Environment Commission. The decision of the City Council shall be final.

<u>9486.2. APPEAL FEE.</u> Any appeal shall be accompanied by that fee as established by resolution of the City Council.

**<u>9487. MODIFICATION OF USES</u>**. No provisions of this Part shall be deemed to grant to the Board any power or authority to deny any use permitted by the Zoning Ordinance, unless contrary to the terms and provisions of the General Plan. No provision of this Part shall be deemed to grant to the Board the power or authority to grant any use in any zone not authorized by the Zoning Ordinance.

**<u>9488. COMPLIANCE REQUIRED.</u>** No person shall violate or fail to comply with any approved development plan or any condition or provision thereof, nor shall a building permit or a certificate of occupancy be issued for any building or structure which would violate or fail to comply with any approved development plan for the parcel on which the building or structure is located. Any occupancy or use of any structure or parcel in violation of an approved development plan is hereby declared to be unlawful and a public nuisance.

**SECTION 3.** CEQA. This ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. This ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will only modify administrative procedures and not result in any changes to the physical environment.

**SECTION 4.** SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

**SECTION 5**. CONTINUITY. To the extent the provisions of the Lakewood Municipal Code as amended by this ordinance are substantially the same as the provisions of that Code as they read immediately prior to the adoption of this ordinance, then those provisions shall be construed as continuations of the earlier provisions and not as new enactments.

**SECTION 6.** CERTIFICATION. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall post a certified copy of this ordinance, including the vote for and against same, in the Office of the City Clerk, in accordance with Government Code Section 36933. The City Council hereby finds and determines there are no newspapers of general circulation both published and circulated within the City and, in compliance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, directs the City Clerk to cause the ordinance within 15 days after its passage to be posted in at least three (3) public places within the City as established by ordinance.

**SECTION 7.** EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be posted or published as required by law and shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

SUBJECT: Amending Municipal Code Regarding Infractions

### INTRODUCTION

City staff recently learned that the Southeast East Area Animal Control Authority (SEAACA) is now effectively prohibited from making court filings for violations of animal control regulations in Lakewood. This is because the Bellflower Court will no longer accept misdemeanor filings for such violations; it will only accept such filings if such violations are treated as infractions.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

The Lakewood Municipal Code at present does not allow for treating animal control violations as infractions because the Code designates all violations to be misdemeanors, except for a short list of violations which may be treated as infractions.

Many other city codes contain blanket discretion, usually vested in the City Attorney, to treat any violation as an infraction. If adopted, the proposed ordinance would codify that discretion in the LMC. This would solve the immediate SEAACA issue. Staff recommends this blanket discretion because it is simply not cost-effective or practical to prosecute most violations of the LMC as misdemeanors.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council conduct a public hearing and introduce the proposed ordinance amending the Lakewood Municipal Code regarding infractions.

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### ORDINANCE NO. 2016-3

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF ARTICLE 1 OF THE LAKEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING INFRACTIONS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following new Section 1206 is hereby added to Chapter 2 of Article 1 of the Lakewood Municipal Code:

"<u>1206. INFRACTIONS - CITY ATTORNEY DISCRETION</u>. In addition to those violations listed in Section 1205, any other violation of this Code may be designated and treated as an infraction, whenever the City Attorney exercises his discretion to treat such violation as an infraction."

SECTION 2. The City Council hereby declares it would have passed this Ordinance sentence by sentence, paragraph by paragraph and section by section, and does hereby declare the provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if for any reason any section of this Ordinance should be held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby finds and determines there are no newspapers of general circulation both published and circulated within the City and, in compliance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, directs the City Clerk to cause said Ordinance within fifteen (15) days after its passage to be posted in at least three (3) public places within the City as established by Ordinance.

### SUBJECT: Justice Assistance Grant Program Funding for Criminal Abatement Team

### INTRODUCTION

For the last several years, a portion of the city's Crime, Public Nuisance and Property Abatement Team was funded by the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program. Each year the Federal government establishes the amount of dollars provided for this program.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The City has been notified that we may claim an entitlement grant of \$17,447 from the Justice Assistance Program and that funding for the deputy on the Abatement Team is an eligible expenditure. The Abatement Team's mission is to identify and "clean up" nuisance single and multiple family housing units and businesses creating a haven for criminal activities. They also address properties that are unsightly, with residents who disturb the peace and safety of Lakewood neighborhoods. The special assignment deputy is a key member of this team and a portion of the contract cost of this deputy can be offset by this grant.

The JAG program requires the City Council to hold a public hearing on the expenditure of these funds and allow citizens to comment.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council approve the submittal of the JAG Program funding for the Crime, Public Nuisance and Property Abatement Team deputy; hold a public hearing and receive public comment on this grant; authorize the City Manager to apply for the grant and sign the appropriate paperwork; and direct the Director of Administrative Services to appropriate \$17,447 in the 2016 JAG grant fund when the grant is awarded.
